LAS VEGAS -- Craig Barrish of Harrah's Casino and Resort saw a woman fall while doing Instagram live video, and got video of his heroic action. The ambulance arrived and carried her to another ambulance. The other woman was interviewed by police and a decision on charges was pending. "There's a lot of people that just see things and you never see if it's your own family or someone else's family and it's very scary and scary to try to figure out what's going on," Barrish said.
