This is a great tool for giving your users a safer IE experience. Reducing the permissions of IE will allow your users to interact with the web in a less secure environment, but with some important limits. You should use this option in situations where Internet Explorer is not used for a purpose that requires a higher level of permissions. Features: This tool removes the permission for "Administrator," "Power User" and "User" groups from IE 7, 8, and 9. It is the recommended way to run Internet Explorer with reduced permissions. "LGBT people and allies are asking all of us to say 'I love you' with acts of kindness, compassion, and non-violent protesting," reads the statement. "We join together to continue praying and demonstrating for justice for those who are most in need and for the protection and acceptance of all people. We honor God's design for marriage between a man and a woman and ask God to heal this nation." In addition to Dallas, which is organizing a Pride Celebration on June 11, Atlanta is hosting a march called "The Freedom March," while the Houston Pride Parade
